

THE CATHEDRAL BELLS

Weights and Inscriptions

(Note) Historically the old Imperial system is still the most frequently used in quoting weights for church bells.

The three figures represent hundredweights (cwt), quarters (qrs) and pounds (lbs).

1cwt = 112 lbs 1qt = 28 lbs i.e. (the Tenor weighs 3295 lbs - 1497 kgs)
