First Reading: Exodus 33.12-23
Response to the Reading: Psalm 99 read responsively as indicated, all seated

The Lord is king: let the peoples tremble; *
he is enthroned upon the cherubim: let the earth shake.

The Lord is great in Zion *
and high above all peoples.

Let them praise your name, which is great and awesome; *
the Lord our God is holy.

Mighty king, who loves justice, you have established equity; *
you have executed justice and righteousness in Jacob.

Exalt the Lord our God; *
bow down before his footstool, for he is holy.

Moses and Aaron among his priests and Samuel among those who call upon
his name, *
they called upon the Lord and he answered them.

He spoke to them out of the pillar of cloud; *
they kept his testimonies and the law that he gave them.

You answered them, O Lord our God; *
